

Council Aleeting Minutes September 21, 2021

The Borough of Ben Avon Council met in a regular voting session on Tuesday, September 21, 2021, virtually and at 7101 Church Avenue for the purpose of transacting General Business. President Jennifer Bett presided and opened the meeting at 7:01 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

His original zoning application was denied by Code Enforcement, and Mr. Tyler has been conversing with the Borough office and the Code Enforcement office to understand the next steps necessary to proceed.

Administration Report

Ms. Bett reported that the Executive Director of QV COG will attend the upcoming work session and demonstrate the OWL projector for the multi-platform Zoom/in-person meetings.

Public Affairs & Communication

Ms. Bett reported the first edition of the Ben Avon Bulletin was distributed to residents, and the Committee plans on publishing two times a year. In addition, Council members are asked to donate time during the Fall Festival to meet with residents and help with the trivia wheel game.

Mr. Stoeckle reported nothing to add to the information submitted by Harshman CE Group this month.

Public Works

Mr. Opipery reported:

- 1. There is a tight paving schedule, but work has begun, and paving should commence the last week of September.
- 2. No hard date was given in the newsletter for a stop to leaf collection, but it will be December 1.
- 3. Forest Avenue sewer will require repairs.

- a. <u>Motion:</u> Mr. Casale; <u>Second:</u> Mr. Wagner, <u>Motion Carried</u> to pay up to \$50K to make emergency sewer repairs if necessary, prior to the next Council meeting.
- 4. Several barriers from Ben Avon Public Works Department have been reported missing.

Quaker Valley COG

<u>Motion:</u> Mr. Casale; <u>Second:</u> Mr. Wagner; <u>Motion Carried</u> to approve the agreement and Resolution 2021-05 entering the contract with Waste Management in 2022.

Mr. Wagner shared Zero Waste Wrangler information with Council which is a program that collects food waste from participating residents and once composted, returns it to the participants for gardening. This would be available to those who wish to participate on an individual level, with no cost to the Borough.

Mr. Wagner stated the County Gaming Economic grants have an upcoming deadline of October 22. Also, the Annual COG Dinner is October 20 for those who wish to participate, and there will be an increase in dues for 2022 of around \$350.

Centennial Building Committee

Mr. Wagner reported a group came to the Borough building on Friday to tour the building and secure architectural drawings to use for work estimates needed to apply for grants and fundraising.

Climate Action Plan

Ms. Roggenkamp reported the draft plan was uploaded to the website, including a Google form link. In addition, copies of the entire plan and executive summary will be available for residents to review at the Fall Festival. She is hoping to have additional public feedback and would hope to put before Council for adoption prior to the end of this year.

Coal Tar Ban

Ms. Bett asked Council to review the information submitted by Mandy Steele to ban coal tar usage in the Borough. Ms. Steele is asking that Council pass an ordinance to ban, however, members felt it would be difficult to enforce. President Bett tabled the discussion for the time being.



Old Business

- Wall and fence ordinance draft review C. Cieslak and M. Smith prepared draft. Houska reviewed, has comments and will send. Chris reviewed process by which she and Mary developed the proposed ordinance. Houska pointed out the need to deconflict with the definitions, 2000-409, 2000-415, 2000-601 and more recent ordinances. Define hedge, wall, landscape borders and what not, add provision for noise abatement walls as it was previously requested by Ben Avon. Kerry suggested hiring a planning consultant to draft and deconflict ordinances. Leann is a professional planner, but lacks time. Houska to reach out to John Trants to present his services for information. Michael asked what purpose would be to seeking outside services. JPC has successfully authored, drafted, reviewed, proposed 9 ordinances in last 10 years. Some very complicated and complex. Believes it is fairly straight-forward effort with 9 people. Dave agrees with Michael, not sure we have funds to justify the cost. What is the purpose of this committee if we outsource to an ordinance consultant? Tulley suggested we could use a consultant to do a final review and deconflict. Michael suggested that Kerry's job is to review our work. Based on discussion, this was tabled. Michael suggested we do a full reading of the fence ordinance at next meeting and resolve conflicts, inconsistencies. All members to review draft. Chris and Mary will revisit Houska's comments and update as needed.
- b. Communication tower revisions to address 5G Tower requirements, Bellevue Request Volunteers needed. Kerry has done some preliminary research and Houska will circulate it.
- c. Bicycle Possible change in direction due to state electrified vehicle Volunteers to agree on meeting date (Houska, Tulley and Leann)



CODE ENFORCEMENT

New complaints being investigated:

449 Dickson Ave - Trees
